Marbhna – A Requiem Mass composed by Odhran O'Casea at Knock Basilica 12 noon Sunday November 6<sup>th</sup>, commemorating all those who died in 1916. Requiem 1916 Marbhna, in Irish, featuring the voice of Síbéal Ní Casaide, is a solemn expression of commemoration. It sets out to explore the beauty of sean nós voice, together with chamber choir and orchestra, classical solo voices, traditional and early music instruments. The blend of Irish and classical music reflects two great musical traditions in Ireland at the time of the Rising. The musical motifs are carried seamlessly from genre to genre. It is the first orchestral setting of a Dies Ires in the Irish language.
